Candidates must choose one word or phrase from a set of four to fill each gap.</p> <p>PART 2 8 QUESTIONS <i>(Use of English component; mainly grammatical)</i> One modified open cloze of a text with eight gaps. Candidates have to identify the right single word which best fits each gap.</p> <p>PART 3 8 QUESTIONS <i>(Use of English component; affixation)</i> One short text with eight gaps, each of which corresponds to a word. The stems of the missing words are given beside the text and candidates have to change them to form the missing words.</p> <p>PART 4 6 QUESTIONS <i>(Use of English component)</i> Six discrete items with a 'lead-in' sentence followed by a key word and a response sentence with a gap. Using the key word, candidates have to complete the response sentence in 3–8 words so that it means the same as the 'lead-in' sentence.</p> <p>PART 5 6 QUESTIONS <i>(Reading component)</i> One long text (700-750 words) with six four-option multiple-choice comprehension questions.</p> <p>PART 6 7 QUESTIONS <i>(Reading component)</i> One gapped text from which paragraphs have been removed and placed in jumbled order after the text. Candidates must decide from where in the text the paragraphs have been removed.</p> <p>PART 6 7 QUESTIONS <i>(Reading component)</i> One long text (or several short texts) followed by multiple-matching questions. Candidates must match a prompt to elements in the text.</p>	<p>20% 1 hour 30 mins</p> <p>QUESTION 1: 240-280 WORDS Candidates are required to write an essay summarizing and evaluating the key ideas contained in two texts of approximately 100 words each.</p> <p>QUESTION 2-5: 280-320 WORDS Candidates choose one of five contextualized writing tasks, each specified in no more than 70 words. For questions 2-4, candidates may have to write an article, letter, report or review. For question 5, candidates may have to write an article, essay, letter, report or review, based on reading one from a prescribed list of two books.</p>	<p>20% 40 mins</p> <p>PART 1 6 QUESTIONS Three short, unrelated recordings lasting approximately 1 minute each, consisting of either monologues or exchanges between interacting speakers. Candidates have to listen to the recordings and answer two multiple-choice questions for each recording. Each question has three options (A, B or C).</p> <p>PART 2 9 QUESTIONS A monologue lasting 3–4 minutes. The questions are a series of incomplete sentences. Candidates have to listen to the recording and identify the information needed (single words or noun groups) to fill each gap.</p> <p>PART 3 5 QUESTIONS A recording involving interacting speakers lasting 3–4 minutes. Candidates have to listen to the recording and answer a series of multiple-choice questions, each with four options.</p> <p>PART 4 10 QUESTIONS Five short themed monologues, of approximately 35 seconds each. There are two multiple-matching tasks, each requiring selection of the five correct options from a list of eight.</p>	<p>20% 16 mins</p> <p>STUDENTS IN PAIRS</p> <p>PART 1 A conversation between the interlocutor and each candidate (spoken questions).</p> <p>PART 2 A two-way conversation between the candidates. The candidates are given instructions with written and visual stimuli, which are used in a decision-making task.</p> <p>PART 3 An individual "long turn" from each candidate followed by a discussion on topics related to the long turns. Each candidate in turn is given a written question to respond to. The interlocutor leads a discussion to explore further the topics of the long turns.</p>

Candidates are not exposed to dialects or background noise. Candidates hear only the speakers' voices and thus they do not risk having their scores unfavorably affected by external factors.</p>	<p>40% 75 mins</p> <p>PART 1 GRAMMAR 40 ITEMS MULTIPLE CHOICE</p> <p>An incomplete sentence is followed by a choice of words or phrases to complete it. Only one choice is grammatically correct.</p> <p>PART 2 CLOZE 20 ITEMS MULTIPLE CHOICE</p> <p>After reading two short cloze passages with 10 items each, from which words or phrases have been removed, examinees must choose one of four options that best fills a missing word/phrase slot in terms of grammar and meaning.</p> <p>PART 3 VOCABULARY 40 ITEMS MULTIPLE CHOICE</p> <p>An incomplete sentence is followed by a choice of words to complete it. Examinees must choose the option that best completes the sentence in terms of meaning.</p> <p>PART 4 READING 20 ITEMS MULTIPLE CHOICE</p> <p>Four reading passages are followed by comprehension questions. Examinees choose the correct answer from the printed answer choices.</p>	<p>20% 30 mins</p> <p>Examinees write an essay based upon one of two topic choices.</p>	<p>20% 35-40 mins</p> <p>50 ITEMS</p> <p>PART 1 MULTIPLE CHOICE</p> <p>A short recorded conversation is accompanied by three printed statements. Examinees choose the statement that conveys the same meaning as what was heard, or that is true based upon the conversation</p> <p>PART 2 MULTIPLE CHOICE</p> <p>A recorded question is accompanied by three printed responses. Examinees choose the appropriate response to the question.</p> <p>PART 3 MULTIPLE CHOICE</p> <p>Three recorded talks, such as those that might be heard on the radio, are each followed by recorded comprehension questions. The questions and the answer choices are printed in the test booklet. Examinees choose the correct answer from the choices.</p>	<p>20% 15 mins</p> <p>STUDENTS IN PAIRS</p> <p>Examinees participate in a semistructured, multistage task involving two (or three) examinees and two examiners.</p>

Each reading passage is followed by 8-12 questions. Typically, each passage is followed by about 10 questions.</p> <p>Text types might include, but are not limited to, newspaper or magazine articles, reviews, editorials, book excerpts, pamphlets, brochures, bulletins, newsletters, and email or other written correspondence.</p> <p>Each passage also contains 1-3 vocabulary questions, a sentence insertion question, and a main idea or other global comprehension question. Some questions may require you to make linguistic inferences based on what you have read.</p>	<p>25% 55mins</p> <p>SECTION 1 35mins</p> <p>The MSU-CELC essay section offers you a choice of two prompts. You will choose one of the two prompts and respond in an essay developed and written to the best of your ability.</p> <p>GRAMMAR TEST 40 ITEMS MULTIPLE CHOICE</p> <p>require test takers to demonstrate their knowledge of advanced English verb tenses and aspects (e.g., past progressive or past perfect), complex clause formation, complement structures, inter-sentential syntactic devices (e.g., pronouns that refer to a phrase in a preceding sentence) and other common and less common features of English grammar. You will read a sentence that contains a gap somewhere in the sentence.</p>	<p>25% 45mins</p> <p>Longer listening passages are played twice</p> <p>PART 1 MULTIPLE CHOICE</p> <p>contains short conversations followed by a single multiple-choice question</p> <p>PART 2 MULTIPLE CHOICE</p> <p>contains medium length conversations followed by three to five multiple-choice questions</p> <p>PART 3 MULTIPLE CHOICE</p> <p>consists of 2 extended dialogs or presentations followed by 8-12 questions each. The questions have only three possible answers.</p> <p>Not only will you be able to preview these questions and look at them while you listen to the passages, but you will hear these extended passages twice.</p>	<p>25% 12-15mins</p> <p>The interview begins with a one-minute warm-up section (not scored) followed by six tasks.</p> <p>The types of tasks on the speaking test include description, narration, and supported opinion.</p> <p>The test includes 1 description, 1 narration, and 4 supported opinion tasks.</p> <p>OBJECTIVES</p> <p>Candidates should bear in mind that meeting the C2 standard implies that they demonstrate the ability to speak spontaneously, fluently and precisely on complex topics with styles that are appropriate to particular listeners in a variety of contexts.</p>
